# Knot & Rope Safety

## Safety

Rope, and sports associated with rope, can be dangerous. Wrongly handled, gripped, or tied, rope can kill, maim, or burn. You could be the victim! Handle rope with care, inspect and test any knot you tie, and respect any rope subject to a heavy load, e.g., a rope controlling a large sail, a mooring rope when you are docking or berthing, and especially your own climbing rope.

## Watch Your Limbs

Never stand in a loop or a bight of a rope which may suddenly tighten, e.g. an anchor line or tow line. You have two legs when you are born. Guard them. That goes for any body parts, fingers, arms, and the like, watch out for coils and small loops. Even a small line wrapped around a finger can cause serious injury when put under sudden strain. And, avoid deliberately wrapping a line/rope around your hand to get a better grip. You may find that the rope has you rather than you having it.

## Control

Never try to control a heavily loaded rope or fishing line with your bare hands. Take two or more turns round a post, winch, or cleat, and use appropriate equipment for fishing line. The danger associated with heavily loaded rope or fishing line is commonly learned by experience, which is often very painful and could be lethal.

## Knots Weaken Rope

Because of knots, kinks, and imperfections, assume that even brand new rope will perform at no more than 50% of its rated breaking strength. And, when dealing with critical loads, it is vital to understand the magnitude of a sensible Safety Factor.

## Working Load and Design Factor

The breaking strength must be markedly greater than the designed load. Although Safety Factor has often been used, Design Factor (DF) is now preferred. A compact summary is provided by the Cordage Institute Guideline CI 1401-15: "As a rule, the more severe the application, the higher the DF needs to be. Selection of a DF in the general range between 5:1 and 12:1 is recommended."

Accordingly, for live or critical loads the DF should be 12, i.e., a rope's breaking strength should be twelve times the load (12:1). To lift an average man, a breaking strength around a ton is indicated.

## Rigging Angle

A rope strong enough to lift a given weight may be totally inadequate when the weight is hanging from the middle of the same rope stretched horizontally, e.g., when rigging a hammock. Too often the effect of such a rigging angle is not appreciated. In certain circumstances, such a mistake may be lethal.

### Dynamic Loads vs. Dead Weights

Similar concerns apply to loads that are moving. A rope stopping a falling object may be subject to a load many times the object's weight.

## Intermittent Loads

Many knots can loosen with prolonged intermittent strain.

## Security and Additional Half Hitches

Mooring lines are exposed to intermittent strains and it is wise to use additional half hitches or a seizing to provide greater security. A seizing is a wrap of small line holding the tail against another adjacent part of the knot. Although a seizing may be very secure, it is a nuisance because it cannot be easily "untied". By contrast, it is quick and convenient to add extra half hitches, and they are commonly found on the: Round Turn & Two Half Hitches, Rolling Hitch, Anchor Hitch, the Clove Hitch and, of course, the Square Knot.

# Square Knot

Application: Joining two ropes

Amateur Radio Example: The rope I brought was too short, so I need to join two pieces together.

## ► Strengths:

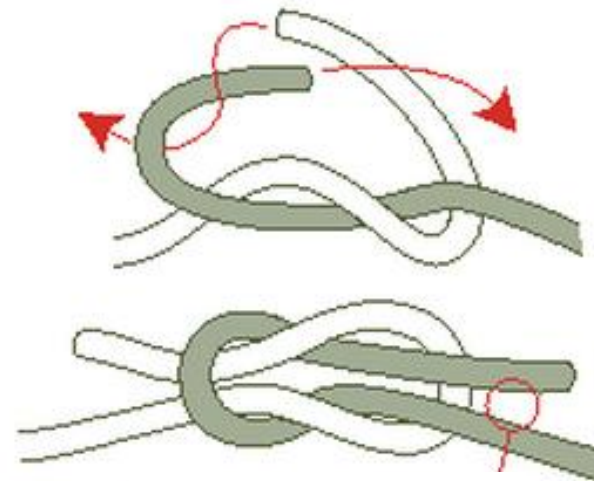
- Simple
- Strong

## Weaknesses:

- It is easy to mis-tie this knot as a “granny” which is a much weaker knot
- It can be difficult to untie after load has been applied
- It does not work well for ropes with different diameters

## SQUARE KNOT

Tie two overhand knots. Remember: left over right and twist, then right over left and twist.



















# Sheet Bend

Application: Joining two ropes (especially ropes of different diameters)

Amateur Radio Example: I need to connect the end of my wire antenna to a tree or stake with rope.

► Strengths:

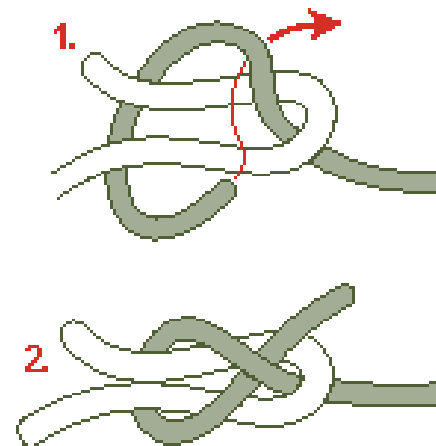
- Simple
- Works for ropes with different diameters
- Can be easily untied (even after load has been applied)

► Weaknesses:

- Can come undone (especially when load is not applied)

## SHEET BEND

Make a loop with the heavier line. Pass second line up through loop, around both heavy lines then back under it self.



















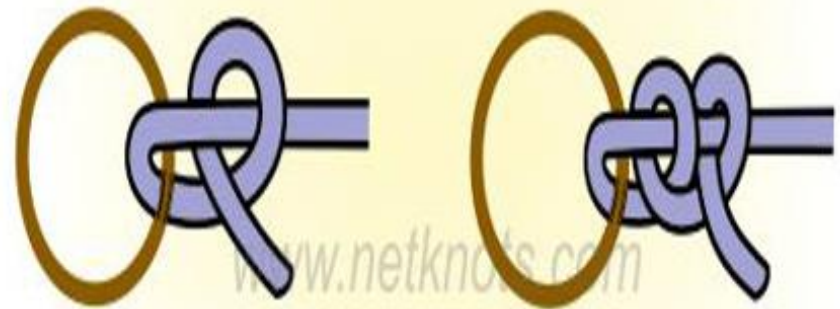
# Two Half Hitches

Application: Attaching a rope to an object

Amateur Radio Example: I need to tie my guy line to my guy ring on my mast.

- ▶ Strengths:
  - ▶ Simple
  - ▶ Strong
- ▶ Weaknesses:
  - ▶ Can be difficult to untie (especially after load has been applied)

# Taut-Line Hitch

Application: Joining a rope to an object

Amateur Radio Example: I need to tie my guy line to a stake or other object. It will need be adjustable but stay in place when I let go.

## ► Strengths:

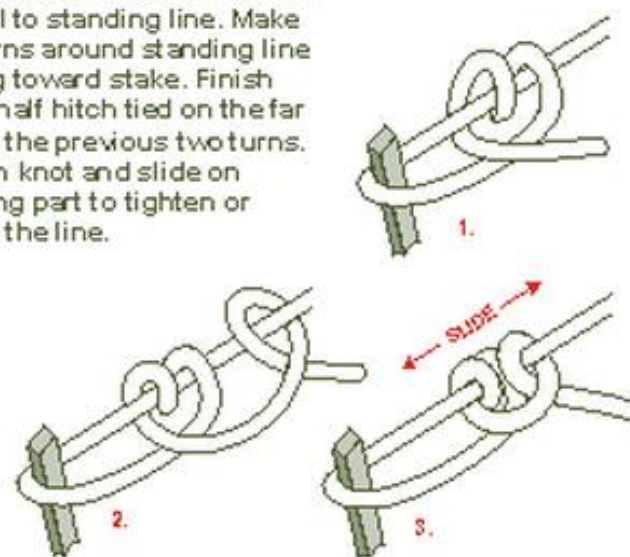
- The knot can be slid up and down the guy rope to ensure the line is taut

## ► Weaknesses:

- The knot can slide back under large loads, causing the line to become slack

## TAUTLINE HITCH

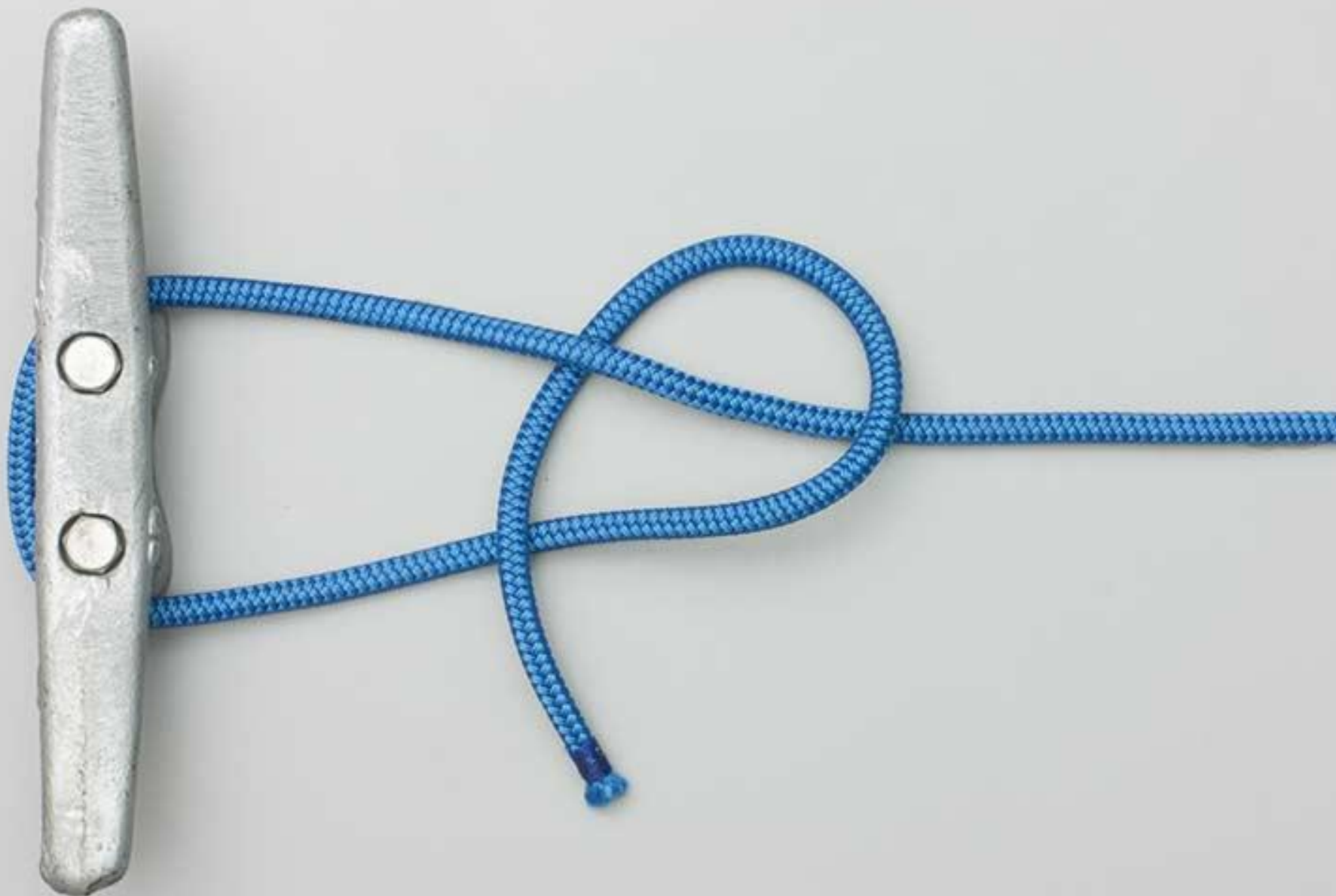
Secure one end of rope. Pass other end around stake and run parallel to standing line. Make two turns around standing line turning toward stake. Finish with a half hitch tied on the far side of the previous two turns. Tighten knot and slide on standing part to tighten or loosen the line.





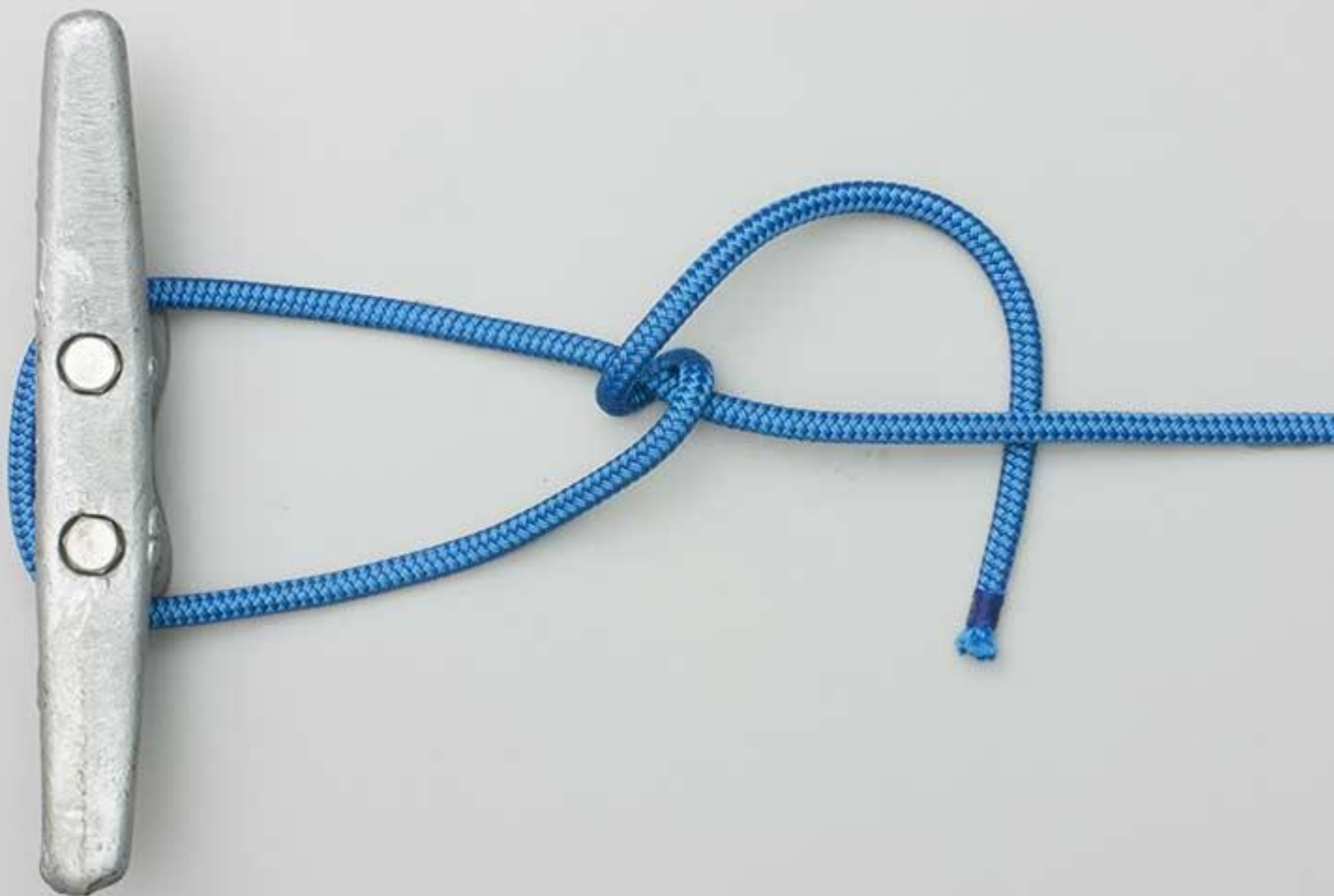


























# Clove Hitch

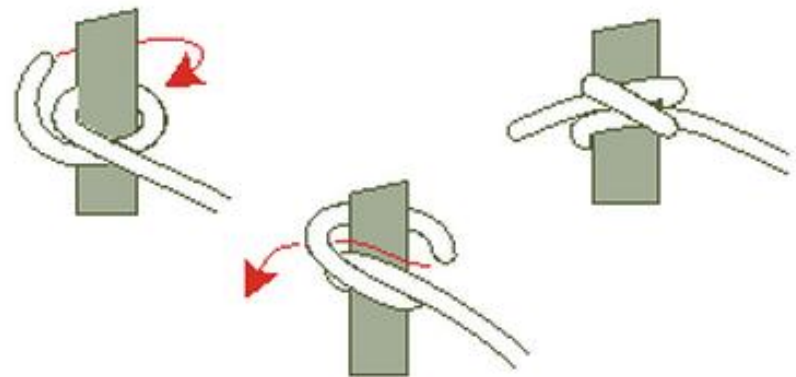
Application: Joining a line to a post

Amateur Radio Example: I need a quick way to tie something to a tree or a pole.

- ▶ Strengths:
  - ▶ Simple
- ▶ Weaknesses:
  - ▶ Can come undone (especially under large loads)

## CLOVE HITCH

Make a turn around a post with the standing part on the top. Take a second turn around in the same direction and feed the free end through the eye of the second turn. Pull tight.



















# Lark's Head (Cow) Hitch

Application: Joining a rope to a post

Amateur Radio Example:  
Attaching your center fed balun to the mast.

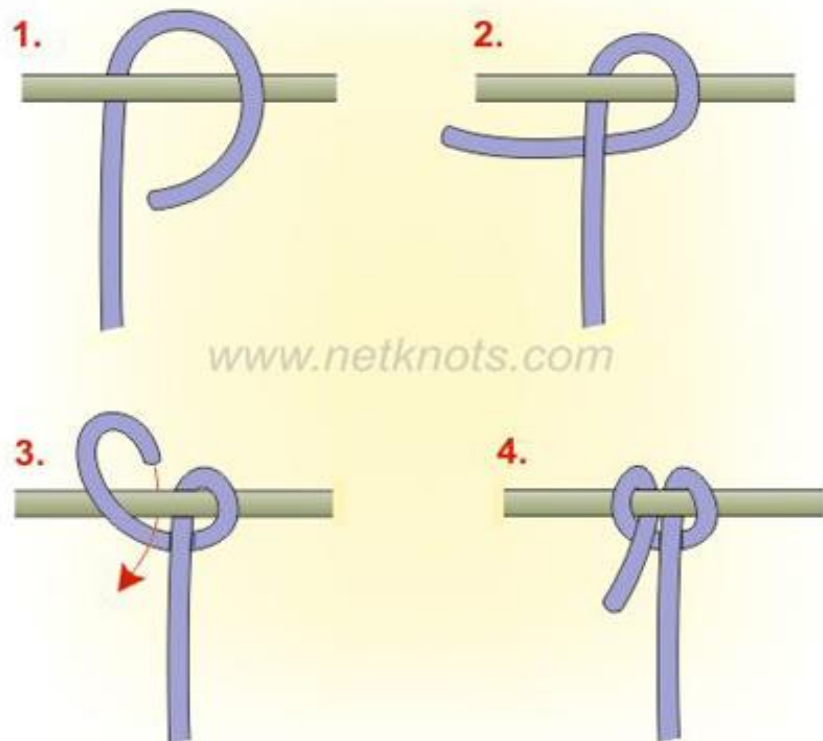
► Strengths:

- Simple
- A bit stronger than a clove hitch
- Can be easily untied (even after load has been applied)

► Weaknesses:

- Can come undone (especially when load is applied)

## COW HITCH



















# Bowline

Application: Joining lines bearing large loads to objects

Amateur Radio Example: Lowering or raising an antenna or mast. Also Hanging items from trees or masts.

## ► Strengths:

- Strong

- Can be easily untied even after large loads have been applied

## ► Weaknesses:

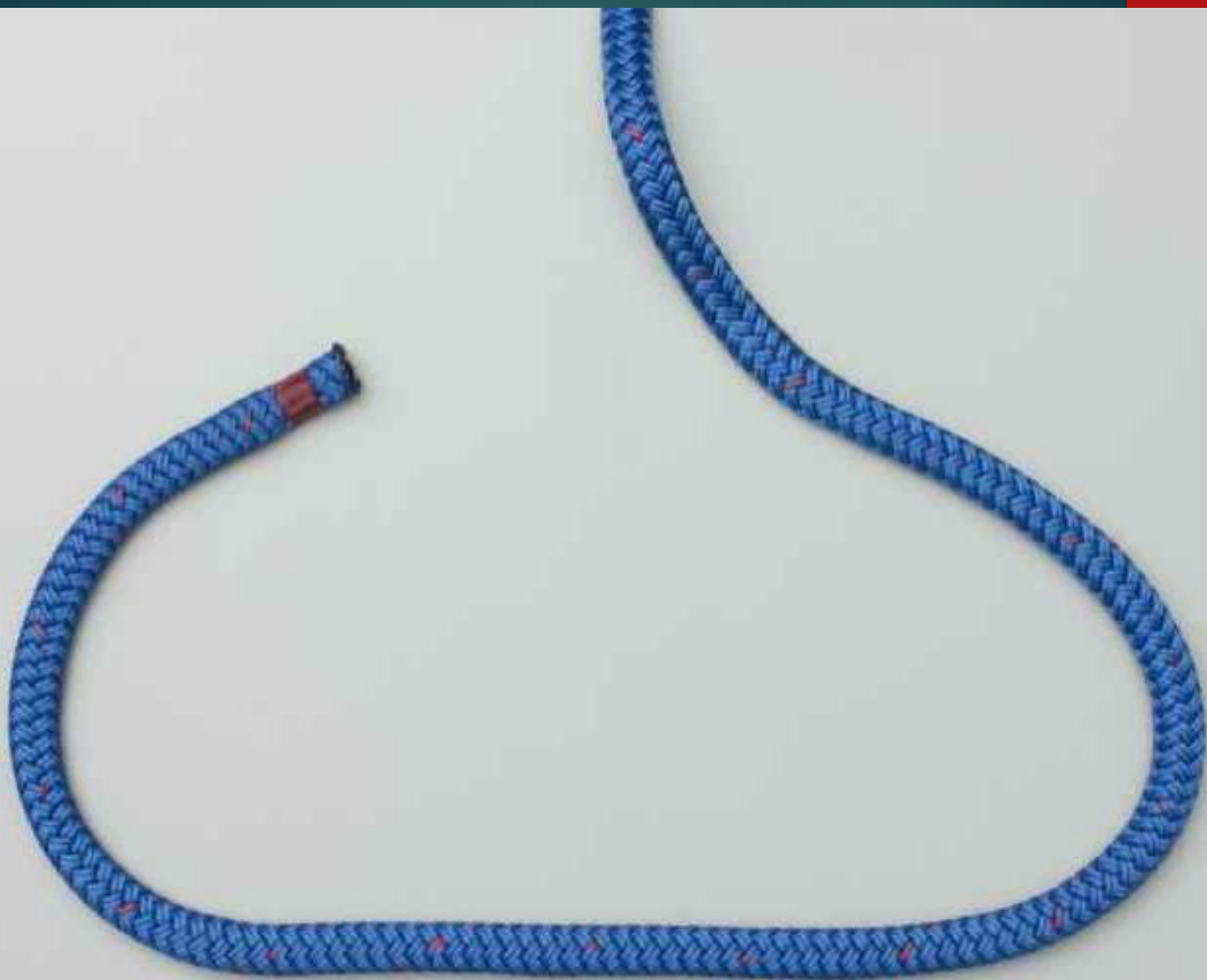
- Can come undone when load is not applied or light

## BOWLINE

Form an eye in the rope with the standing part underneath. Run the free end up through the eye then take a turn around the standing part.

Feed the free end back down into the eye and hold there while pulling standing part to tighten down knot.

# CONSTITUTION AND BYLAWS OF THE AMATEUR RADIO CLUB OF COLUMBIA COUNTY, INC.

~~FEBRUARY~~JANUARY 37, 20265





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## **Article I. PURPOSE**

The name of the organization is the Amateur Radio Club of Columbia County, Inc., will be a non-profit, charitable organization and will perform public service in Columbia County, Georgia and the surrounding area by:

### **Section 1.01 Education**

Providing educational and training programs and activities which promote the hobby of amateur radio for licensed amateur radio operators and those interested in the hobby,

### **Section 1.02 Emergency Communications**

Providing radio communications during times of emergency and for emergency preparedness training activities,

### **Section 1.03 Communications Assistance**

Providing communication assistance for various public and charitable projects and activities,

### **Section 1.04 Cooperation**

Cooperating with other similar organizations in promoting scientific and educational activities, and

### **Section 1.05 ARRL**

Affiliation with the American Radio Relay League (ARRL).

### **Section 1.06 Specific Purpose**

The specific purpose is to preserve, promote, proliferate, and educate on Amateur Radio, as well as to assist governmental and non-governmental agencies in times of emergencies/disasters.

At no time will the organization ask for compensation for services rendered.



## **Article II. MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

### **Section 2.01 Board of Directors Organization**

The Board of Directors of this organization will consist of a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Board Member at Large. The Board of Directors ("Board") will serve the organization and will be answerable to the members. The Board of Directors will not receive paid compensation for their duties in the organization.

### **Section 2.02 President**

The President will be the Chief Executive Officer and run the affairs of the organization.

### **Section 2.03 Vice President**

The Vice President will serve in the absence of the President or at the President's direction.

### **Section 2.04 Secretary**

The Secretary will be responsible for keeping records of Board actions, including overseeing the taking of minutes at all board, general and special called meetings, sending out meeting announcements, distributing copies of minutes and the agenda to each Board member, and assuring that corporate records except for financial records are maintained.

### **Section 2.05 Treasurer**

The Treasurer will be the Chief Financial Officer and will make a report at each General meeting. Treasurer will be a member of the finance committee, assist in the preparation of the budget, help develop fundraising plans, and make financial information of the organization available to members and the public. All financial records of the organization will be maintained by the treasurer.

### **Section 2.06 Board Member at Large**

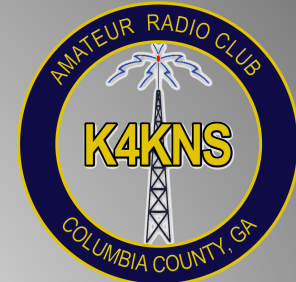
The Board Member at Large may be asked to serve in the capacity of a board member missing at a meeting. For example, when the treasurer is absent, this board member may be asked by another board member to assume the responsibilities of the treasurer for the duration of the meeting.

### **Section 2.07 Board of Directors Elections**

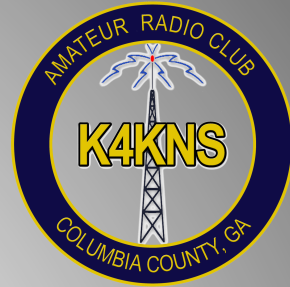

## 4. Membership – Written Application removal

### (a) Membership Application

Anyone desiring a membership in the organization must submit a n ~~written~~ application for desired membership type. This application will be presented to the members present at a regularly scheduled meeting. The applicant may~~will~~ be excused from the meeting and the members will then vote on acceptance of the applicant. A two thirds (2/3) majority vote of the voting members present at the meeting will be required for the applicant to be accepted as a member of the organization.



**(b) Membership Withdrawal**

Members may withdraw their membership by providing written notification (letter or e-mail) to any board member.

**(c) Membership Behavior**

Any member whose behavior is determined to be detrimental to the ARCCC, Inc. or to Amateur Radio may have their membership in the organization brought into question using the following steps.

**(i) Mediation Request to Board of Directors**

Any accusations are required to be presented with pertinent details in writing to the Board. The Board will then act as a mediator between the accused and accuser.

**(ii) Mediation – First Attempt**

The Board will facilitate a meeting between the accused and accuser within 10 days and attempt to resolve the issue to the satisfaction of all present. If no satisfactory resolution can be achieved by the board, the accuser and accused will be notified and the issue will be brought before the organization for a written vote at the next regularly scheduled meeting.

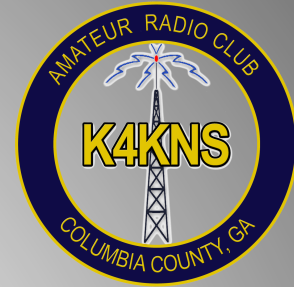
**(iii) Mediation – Second Attempt**

If membership of any individual in the organization is brought into question before the organization, a two thirds (2/3) majority vote of the members present will be required to revoke the membership of the accused. All issues will be discussed by the organization before the vote. After the vote is taken, the presiding board member will announce the results.

**(iv) Membership Application after Revocation**

Any person who has had their membership revoked by vote of the organization must wait one (1) year before re-applying for membership in the organization.





## Article V. FINANCES

~~VotingFull~~ Member annual dues will be established by the organization membership and recorded in the minutes of the regularly scheduled meeting when the vote is taken. ~~Such dues will then be recorded on the organization's website.~~ Dues must be paid annually. There will be a grace period of 7 days following the due date, and during this time members can pay their annual dues without penalty. 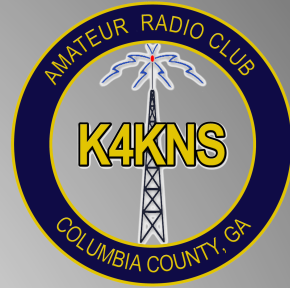

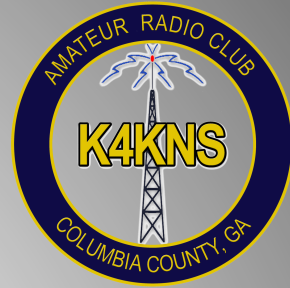
#### **(a) Presidential Discretionary Expenditures**

The President will have access to up to \$500 for discretionary purchases for the organization over the span of his/her term. 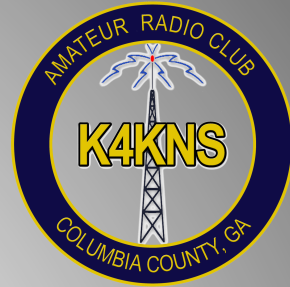

# 8. Presidential Discretionary Expenditures – Process clarification



## (a) Presidential Discretionary Expenditures

## Article VI. MEETINGS

Meetings of the organization will be held monthly January through November at the specified location / virtual platform. A quorum of at least 10 members must be present before business can be transacted or motions made or passed. A vote of 2/3 majority is needed for a motion to pass.

## Article VII. AMENDMENT

This document may be amended by the members. Any change must be proposed at a regularly scheduled meeting and voted on at a later meeting, either a regularly scheduled meeting or a specially called meeting. All changes must be approved by a two thirds (2/3) majority vote of the members present at the meeting. This Constitution and By-Laws will become the rules of this organization when approved by a two thirds (2/3) majority vote of those present at the meeting in which the vote is taken. Such vote and approval will be recorded in the minutes of the meeting. The results of the vote and Constitution and Bylaws as amended will be published on the organization's website.

## Article VIII. 501(c)3 STATUS

The organization will maintain its 501(c)3 status. In the event of the dissolution of the organization, all assets and funds remaining will be distributed in their entirety to another organization which has Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)3 status~~(501(c)3 status with the Internal Revenue Service and as set forth by the Articles of Incorporation.~~

It is the intention of this document to comply with all 501(c)3 requirements. If any portion of this document is found to be in conflict of the 501(c)3 provisions, 501(c)3 will take precedence~~presidency~~ for that instance only.
